

Comments/Suggestions: Improve the downtown The vibracy of a downtown is how a city's economic strength and vitality is measured - downtown park with playground needed. Parents can shop, and then reward kids with time at the park - improve pedestrian traffic with more downtown housing (pref. a mix of high-end condos /rentals to some lower-income houses). If no one lives downtown, no one will use downtown - bike racks, so people can actually bike downtown - decrease the number of parking lots. They are ugly and do not add to the landscape of the city. Have more mutli-level parking lots to replace them. - Help small business owners improve their store fronts (financial incentives, tax breaks etc.) - More patios needed - Garbage cans for recyling...most major cities have them now Bedford Tot Park, The playground for the university area is sad and is rarely used, despite the increased numbers of families with small children who have moved into the area. Improvements are needed, such as: - a toddler play area (the city of Oakville, smaller pop., but roughly same property taxes per capita has a toddler playset, an older child playset and a water park at almost all their playgrounds) improvement of the older children play structure - a bench for parents to sit on - a garbage can that doesn't blow over (possibly one with recyling??) - bike rack, so children can lock up their bikes - basketball hoop for the older kids/teens and adults in the area Bike path from the university to downtown Ramsey Lake Rd is very dangerous to walk/ride on, however there is no other route out of the university area. Most cars drive too fast, a bike path from the university area to the downtown would improve this situation. It would also give the students access to the downtown core, thereby promoting the vibracy of the city. Parents and children would have better access to Bell Park...which, so far, has the only decent playground in the area.
