## Faculty

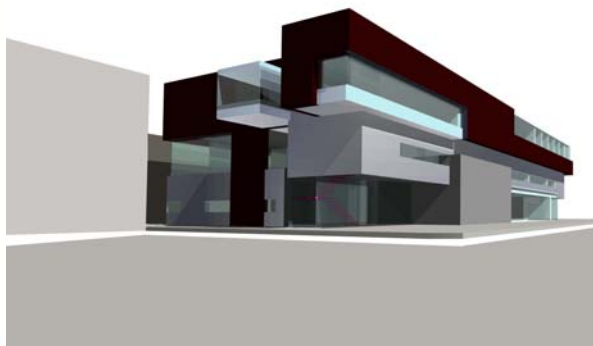


Hundreds of physicians and health care practitioners from all disciplines will make up the clinical faculty.
