Attached is a letter dated June 20, 2005 which was submitted by Mr. Hank Rowlinson of The Métis Nation of Ontario requesting Council's approval for an exemption from Chapter 776 of the former City of Sudbury Municipal Code (Noise By-law) for the 12<sup>th</sup> Annual General Assembly to be held on July 4-9, 2005 at Richard Lake (Carol's Campsite) in Sudbury. This celebration will offer a variety of family and youth oriented events, workshops and musical entertainment throughout the week with an anticipated attendance of 300-500 people from across Ontario. SCHEDULE 'A'

### **CONDITIONS:**

- 1. That the special event organizer shall ensure the provision of adequate clean-up of the site and those properties adjacent to the event area no later than 12:00 o'clock noon on Monday, July 11, 2005;
- 2. That the event representative ensure emergency vehicles have access to the event area;
- 3. That all Ontario Fire Code regulations must be adhered to, in particular, with respect to Section 2.8 that indicates a Fire Safety Plan is required for this event;
- 4. That no bonfires of any kind, barbecues or similar types of cooking devises shall be operated on the site without the consent of the Fire Chief, and that an approved fire extinguisher be provided for each of the foregoing;
- 5. That no outside entertainment system be permitted, however, if outdoor amplified sound equipment is in use, all speakers and speaker stacks shall be positioned to tilt downward into the crowd versus projecting straight over the crowd or adjoining properties;
- 6. That the special event organizer, or his designate, must be present on the site during the entire duration of the event.
- 7. That any tent be erected in accordance with the provisions of the Ontario Building Code.
- 8. The event organizer shall notify the neighbours and provide the City Clerk with a copy of said notification.

#### Re: Noise By-Law Exemption Request

The Métis Nation of Ontario (MNO) is a non-for profit community oriented organization. Every year an Annual General Assembly (AGA) is held that brings together Métis people from throughout the province of Ontario. This year's 12<sup>th</sup> Annual Assembly will be held July 4<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup>, 2005 at Richard Lake (Carol's Campsite) in the historical Métis community of Sudbury Ontario. As part of this celebration, the Métis Nation of Ontario offers a variety of family and youth oriented events, workshops and musical entertainment for the estimated 300 to 500 delegates and guests in attendance.

This event has a great economic effect on the local community. We estimate that the event will pump 2.5 million dollars into the Sudbury community and is a vehicle to enrich mainstream audiences on the Métis culture and traditions.

Each evening is filled with live entertainment from 7:00PM to 12:00 AM. We have confirmed presenters and performers from all across the province and have focused on contracting a majority of our artists from the Greater City of Sudbury and require the noise exemption so that we can complete our evening programming.

Taking into account that there are houses across the lake, we have carefully taken every measure possible to ensure that music performed after 11:00 p.m. will not be an inconvenience to residents. When positioning our main entertainment tent and stage, it will be located 500 feet from the lake and the main tent will be positioned to allow any uncontained noise to filter into the bush instead of it echolog across the lake.



As part of the 2005 budget deliberations, Council approved the co-location of EMS and Fire Services personnel in four (4) reporting Emergency Services Stations located throughout the city. In addition to the co-habitation issue, the Van Horne Station needed to be renovated to allow for the addition of female fire fighters into the career component. In order for the co-location and co-habitation to proceed, four stations needed to be renovated. Three of the four stations are now completed, and the last to be renovated is the Van Horne Station.

Unforeseen costs will occur in the areas of material, expenses (steel), insurance, labour, fuel, and changes to the scope of work required to bring on female fire fighters into Van Horne Station.

The City has committed and awarded the contract to Quality Contracting Inc. The contractor has personnel and equipment standing by to execute his renovations in accordance with our plan.

There is a requirement for an additional \$149,800 to complete the project. It is recommended that \$100,000 be relocated from the EMS Ambulance Reserve Fund and the balance of up to \$49,800 be funded through the Fire Building Maintenance Account.

### **Uncommitted Funds**

EMS Ambulance Reserve Fund \$124,000

(\$24,000 remaining after the project)

Fire Building Maintenance Account \$60,000 (\$10,200 remaining after the project)
