#### **BACKGROUND**

In 2004, the Technical Steering Committee (TSC) recommended and Council approved a one week period that residential tipping fees would be waived along with the exemption of four passenger/light truck tires per day, pending a new revenue source.

The new revenue source was identified and the TSC recommended and Council approved to proceed with the event in February 2005. The week was held in conjunction with the Clean Sweep program and scheduled for May 2<sup>nd</sup> to May 7<sup>th</sup>, 2005.

#### **PROGRAM INFORMATION**

**Clean Sweep** - The "Clean Up Greater Sudbury" Program together with Waste Management of Canada Inc. introduced the Clean Sweep initiative.

The Clean Sweep initiative shifts the focus from litter clean-ups to personal responsibility and litter prevention. This new initiative will raise litter awareness with property owners.

The contest is designed to reward residents who promote community pride by setting an example. Judges from the Solid Waste Division and Waste Management of Canada Inc. toured local entries during the first week of May. They were looking for yards that were litter free and which demonstrated a commitment to regular composting, recycling and regreening initiatives.

Residents could register in the program or be nominated. Waste Management of Canada Inc. sponsored the cash prizes.

**No Residential Tipping Fees** - Greater Sudbury citizens delivering household waste and passenger/light truck tires by a private motor vehicle were eligible for the residential tipping fee holiday during this week.

Up to four passenger/light truck tires with rims removed were allowed each day. There was no limit on the amount of non-hazardous household waste that a resident could deliver. Segregation and diversion of recyclable items was encouraged (i.e. household appliances, tires, concrete bricks/blocks, scrap metal, electronics, blue box recyclables, non-treated wood waste, leaf and yard trimmings, sod).

#### **RESULTS** - Continued

#### No Residential Tipping Fees -

A total of 10,030 trips were made to the four landfill sites during this week and 8,291 tires were disposed of at no cost to the resident. Over 30% of users delivered 100 kg or less, approximately 30% delivered between 100 kg and 200 kg.

Many users were delivering items that are normally exempt from tipping fees (appliances, leaf & yard trimmings etc). It was a great opportunity to hand out landfill diversion information sheets.

The cost of this week was approximately \$140,000 which includes the reduction of tipping fees, and extra operational staff.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

The results of the week were taken to the May 26<sup>th</sup>, 2005 TSC meeting. The TSC is recommending the following:

"That the Clean Sweep/No Residential Tipping Fee Week be adopted as a permanent program. That the event be held for the first week of May and that the number of passenger/light truck tires accepted at no charge be increased from 4 to 8 per day".

#### **Background:**

Attached is a letter and application submitted by Pastor Klaus H. Saari of Abundant Life Healing Centre requesting Council's approval for an exemption from Chapter 776 of the former City of Sudbury Municipal Code (Noise By-law) in order to hold a Christian Motorcycle Rally fund raiser and Camp meeting. These events are to be held on June 30 to July 18, 2005 at 360 Perreault Street, Sudbury with an anticipated attendance of 200-300 people.

#### SCHEDULE 'A'

#### **CONDITIONS:**

- 1. That the special event organizer shall ensure the provision of adequate clean-up of the site and those properties adjacent to the event area no later than 12:00 o'clock noon on the Monday following the event;
- 2. That the event representative ensure emergency vehicles have access to the event area;
- 3. That all Ontario Fire Code regulations must be adhered to, in particular, with respect to Section 2.8 that indicates a Fire Safety Plan is required for this event;
- 4. That no bonfires of any kind, barbecues or similar types of cooking devises shall be operated on the site without the consent of the Fire Chief, and that an approved fire extinguisher be provided for each of the foregoing;
- 5. That no outside entertainment system be permitted, however, if outdoor amplified sound equipment is in use, all speakers and speaker stacks shall be positioned to tilt downward into the crowd versus projecting straight over the crowd or adjoining properties;
- 6. That the special event organizer, or his designate, must be present on the site during the entire duration of the event.
- 7. That any tent be erected in accordance with the provisions of the Ontario Building Code.


