



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Leisure Services Department receives requests every year from a number of groups planning outdoor licensed activities during community special events throughout the summer, wishing to use the City of Greater Sudbury parks and facilities to extend the operating hours of parks and to be exempted from the Noise By-Law. These requests require Council approval.

BACKGROUND

The Leisure Services Department receives requests from a number of groups planning community special events throughout the summer using City of Greater Sudbury parks and facilities.

Groups request permission to obtain Special Occasion Permits to operate licensed areas in the parks as part of the fundraising efforts of the events. Some of the groups request an extension to the operating hours of parks beyond 11:00 p.m. Current by-laws governing the operation of parks call for an 11:00 p.m. closure from both an operating point of view as well as noise.

The attached schedule summarizes the events and the various approvals being requested from Council.

Council confirms the nature of these events as community festivals and that they are of municipal significance to our community. A significant event is an event of municipal, provincial, national or international significance. Events of municipal significance must be designated as such by resolution of municipal council and included with the application for a Special Occasion Permit.

The approval of each group is subject to the following conditions:

1. That the special event organizer shall ensure that the provision of adequate clean-up of the site and those properties adjacent to the event, immediately following the event;
2. That all Ontario Fire Code regulations must be adhered to, in particular, with respect to Section 2.8 that indicates a Fire Safety Plan is required for these events;
3. That no bonfires of any kind, barbeques or similar types of cooking devices shall be operated on site without the consent of the Fire Chief, and that an approved fire extinguisher be provided for each of the foregoing;
4. That when outdoor amplified sound equipment is in use, all speakers and speaker stacks shall be positioned to tilt downward into the crowd versus projecting straight over the crowd at adjoining properties;
5. That the special event organizer, or their designate, must be present on site during the entire duration of the event.







May 13, 2005 to July 15, 2005 between the hours 6 o'clock p.m. of each day and 7 o'clock a.m. of the next following day;

AND THAT T.A. Clarke & Associates Inc. shall ensure proper traffic control is in place during this period;

AND THAT approval of this exemption be subject to T.A. Clarke & Associates Inc. providing public notice of this construction activity with a copy to be provided to the City Clerk's Office for distribution to staff and City Council;

AND FURTHER THAT T.A. Clarke & Associates Inc. notify the residents of Belfry Avenue, Mountview Crescent, and Attlee Avenue of the above noted matter.

BACKGROUND:

The City Clerk's Office has received a request from Mr. Steve Smith, P.Eng. of T.A. Clarke & Associates Inc. for an exemption to Chapter 776 of the former City of Sudbury Municipal Code (Noise By-law) for the period of May 13-31, 2005 in order to install new parking lot grades, curbs and asphalt around the new Future Shop building at the New Sudbury Centre, 1349 Lasalle Boulevard, Sudbury in advance of their opening on June 2, 2005. Mr. Smith advised that this request is required in order to leave as much parking in place for the mall during the day which would allow unrestricted access to the parking fields at night for resurfacing.

Secondly, T.A. Clarke & Associates Inc. has also requested an exemption to Chapter 776 of the former City of Sudbury Municipal Code (Noise By-law) for the period of June 10, 2005 to July 15, 2005 to demolish the existing Future Shop building at the New Sudbury Centre, 1349 Lasalle Boulevard, Sudbury. This would allow their contractors to demolish this building as quickly as possible in order to re-establish the footprint into parking in advance of the new Walmart opening in early August 2005.

Date: Thursday, May 5, 2005

Mr. Smith has indicated that the contractors involved will be Lacroix Construction, Interpaving Ltd., Pioneer Construction, Hollaway Construction, and possibly Candu Engineering & Construction.

As indicated by Mr. Smith, demolition and resurfacing is scheduled to occur between May 13, 2005 and July 15, 2005 outside of the hours of the operation of the New Sudbury Centre. Therefore, exemption has been requested between the hours 6 o'clock p.m. of each day and 7 o'clock a.m. of the next following day.

A check of the By-law Office was conducted to determine if any noise complaints had been received. Mr. Gutjahr indicated that they have received no noise complaints regarding this project since March 8, 2005.

The Office of the Director of Engineering Services has indicated that all road construction for this area (Lasalle Boulevard and Belfry Avenue) has been deferred until next year.

CorrieJo,

I wish to once again make formal application to the City of Greater Sudbury for relief from the noise bylaw restrictions for specific work upcoming at the New Sudbury Center as part of the ongoing redevelopment work.

Firstly, we will be installing curbs, new parking lot grades and asphalt around the new Future Shop building in advance of their opening on June 2, 2005. As the parking lot(s) currently are severely restricted due to the ongoing work, we would request relief from the noise bylaw for the month of May so that we may leave as much parking in place for the mall during the day and have unrestricted access to the parking fields for resurfacing at night. The contractors involved would include Interpaving Ltd., Pioneer Construction, Hollaway Construction, and perhaps Candu Eng. and Construction.

Secondly, we would request relief for the period of June 10, 2005 to July 15, 2005 for the demolition of the existing Future Shop building. Our schedule requires that this building be demolished as quickly as possible so that we can re-establish the footprint into parking in advance of the new Walmart opening in early August. The contractor involved will be Lacroix Construction (and any haulage subcontractors engaged to work for Lacroix).

Please contact me if you require further information regarding these two operations, and advise as soon as council may have a decision.

CorrieJo,

I have asked for these two exemptions at this time as these are current known dates. I would anticipate requesting another exemption for the demolition of the existing Walmart store and subsequent site work necessary to establish the new parking field along LaSalle Blvd in late summer/fall. The exact dates I have for this work are not confirmed as of now, but current projections for the Walmart demo etc... are Sept 6, 2005 until close of asphalt plants in November. We cannot currently specify the hours we would require, but at this time we can certainly foresee extended evening hours being required.

The timing of paving at Future Shop is currently being planned as Saturday and Sunday work from mall close at 6 and 5 pm until approx midnight, but given our tight schedule to prepare for the Future Shop opening on June 2, 2005 we would need some flexibility given weather etc..

The Future Shop demo exemption we are seeking is for extended hours into the evenings (past a standard 7am - 4pm work day) but we do not foresee "nighttime ops".

We have not yet notified the public as you have indicated as we are awaiting the decision of council or committee. Should you advise that we publish our prospective schedule(s) we will undertake that immediately.
