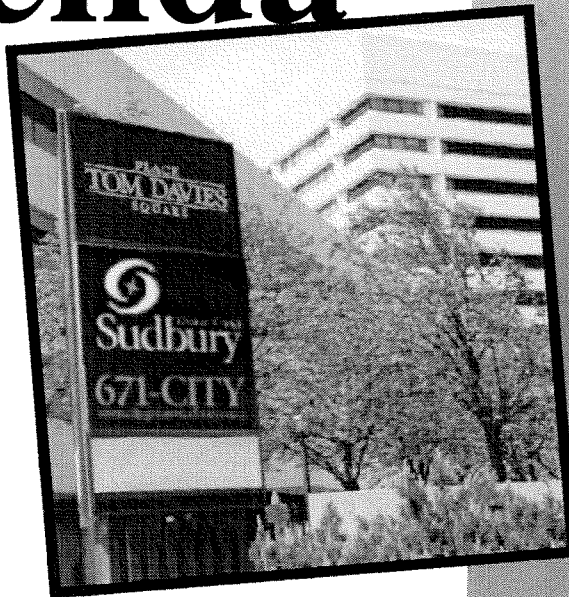

R-8 **Presented by Councillor Dupuis:**

WHEREAS the Government of Ontario has been pursuing municipal restructuring and the realignment of local services as a means to reduce the size and cost of local government;

AND WHEREAS the Honourable Tony Clement, when as Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing on the first reading of Bill 25 stated that the new municipalities to be created, including the City of Greater Sudbury, "will be built on the best practices of progressive municipalities across North America. They will retain their strong, local identities and communities. Each will develop a new, solid economic base from which to work together to attract investment and create new jobs. They will be municipalities to help Ontario move forward in strength and competitiveness into the 21st century";

R-8 Presented by Councillor Dupuis: (Continued)

AND WHEREAS the Provincial Government announced a variety of funds to assist municipalities with restructuring and transition;

AND WHEREAS in a Press Release, dated January 3rd, 2001, the Honourable Tony Clement announced transition funding of \$11.49 million for the City of Kawartha Lakes;

AND WHEREAS the Minister stated in this Press Release that: "The province is assisting municipalities with up to 75 per cent of eligible costs."

AND WHEREAS on February 7th, 2001 the Municipal Affairs and Housing Minister Tony Clement announced transition funding for the new City of Greater Sudbury of \$19.2 million, "representing 50 per cent of the transition costs, plus the interest to borrow the other 50 per cent";

AND WHEREAS the transition funding for the City of Kawartha Lakes worked out to \$179.39 per capita compared to \$116.19 per capita for the City of Greater Sudbury;

AND WHEREAS the transition costs for the City of Greater Sudbury are estimated to have topped \$26 million;

AND WHEREAS this funding shortfall means that the City of Greater Sudbury will start with a \$9 million debt in a community that is currently debt free, has maintained a "pay as you go" policy for over a decade, and whose municipal councils have worked diligently to ensure that local taxes have not increased for nine years;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREATER SUDBURY HEREBY RESOLVES THAT:

1. the Province of Ontario be petitioned to provide 100% of the transition costs for the City of Greater Sudbury; and that,
2. His Worship Mayor Gordon be authorized to lead a delegation, to include Deputy Mayors Craig and Gainer, to meet with the Honourable Chris Hodgson, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, at the earliest opportunity, to secure payment in full of the restructuring costs for the City of Greater Sudbury.

WHEREAS the City of Greater Sudbury has declared that extension of broadband and utilization of fibre optics should be among its primary goals for this term;

AND WHEREAS Greater Sudbury Utilities Inc. has established a Telecom Division;

AND WHEREAS there has already been much work done developing a project entitled "The Station" which embraces the goals expressed by the City of Greater Sudbury;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the City of Greater Sudbury hereby authorizes and encourages the Greater Sudbury Utilities Inc., in co-operation with the Economic Development arm of the City of Greater Sudbury, to promote and seek partners and sources of funding to ensure that the City of Greater Sudbury attains the primary goals relating to telecommunications as established on February 9th, 2001;

AND FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED THAT a report be prepared and brought to a combined meeting of the Greater Sudbury Utilities Inc. and the Council of the City of Greater Sudbury as soon as possible.

WHEREAS the price of vehicle fuel is at its highest and continues to rise;
