#### R-7 Presented by Councillor Bradley:

WHEREAS Highway 144 between Levack and Timmins is very narrow with inadequate shoulders to allow trucks and other vehicles to safely pull over to the side of the road; and

WHEREAS currently truck drivers are required to stop on the roadway in order to perform maintenance work and check their rigs; and
