

ONTARIO CHAPTER Solid Waste Association of North America

Manager of Landfill Operations (MOLO) Course

June 11-14

The course (followed by an optional challenge exam) will be held over a period of three and a half days and will earn you 30 credits towards certification. The aim of the course is to provide those involved in the daily management of municipal solid waste landfills with the basic information upon which a successful operation runs.

Upon completion of this course, each participant will have been instructed in all of the areas that will be tested through SWANA's certification examination. The understanding of the issues that have to be considered when planning, operating and closing a landfill will also be covered. Participants will interact with peers and learn about new ways to approach landfill management and operations.

Doug Robinson is a solid waste management industry advisor and instructor who specializes in landfill management consulting and best practice techniques and methods for landfill operations. He has worked in various public and private capacities with government regulatory bodies, municipalities, regional governments, private sector companies and engineering firms.

Ron McCaw is a Civil Engineering Technician, a Senior Survey Technologist and holds Masters degrees in Community Planning and Environmental Science. In addition, he holds class # 1 licenses in both water treatment and distribution systems and waste water treatment and collection systems.

Course Outline:

Lesson 1: Introduction and Pre-Test

The first lesson provides an overview of the entire three-day program. A short test is given to aid the participants and instructors in better understanding the extent of knowledge of the participants.

Lesson 2: Role of Sanitary Landfills in Integrated Municipal Solid Waste Management

Review of the relationship of landfills to integrated solid waste management systems.

Lesson 3: Basics of Landfill Site Restrictions

Addresses the factors which are considered when selecting a site for a landfill and how the selection affects the design and operation of a landfill.

Lesson 4: Communications

Covers topics essential to good communications with internal and external stakeholders.



MOLO Course Outline (continued):

Lesson 5: Complying with Design Requirements

Reviews the principles of landfill design and presents instruction in plan review, plan reading, plan interpretation and filed interpretation of design.

Lesson 6: Waste Acceptance and Screening

Addresses the importance of maintaining control of waste delivered to a landfill including asbestos, hazardous waste, biomedical waste, recyclables and toxics, etc.

Lesson 7: Leachate, Landfill Gas and Settlement

Addresses the decomposition process that occurs within a landfill and how various wastes affect the decomposition process. It also provides information on the generation of the decomposition products.

Lesson 8: Control Processes for LFG and Leachate

Examines in detail control and treatment technologies for landfill gas and groundwater monitoring, storm water management and reviews remedial actions procedures.

Lesson 9: Operation Techniques

Provides instruction on the most acceptable and advanced techniques of landfill operation. The instructor discusses waste control, equipment utilization, operations staffing, site capacity optimum utilization, cell construction and procedures to determine compliance with design and permit conditions.

Lesson 10: Compliance and Inspection

Provides instruction for landfill managers and enforcement officers on the inspection techniques for landfills. A landfill evaluation/inspection technique is used as part of the field exercise to emphasize correct techniques.

Lesson 11: Field Exercise

The field exercise will take place at Keele Valley Landfill Site. Participants are given opportunities for hands-on experience at stations for operations, groundwater sampling, soils and landfill gas sampling, as well as to evaluate the landfill against the design and permit conditions of the facility.

Lesson 12: Closure and Long Term Care

Addresses closure and post-closure requirements for a landfill. Discussions include final cover, final cover maintenance, groundwater and landfill gas monitoring and settlement control.

Lesson 13: Landfill Economics

Examines the economics of landfill design and operation and the relationship among equipment, staffing, operations, and compliance monitoring costs.

Lesson 14: Provincial Regulations

Reviews the provincial landfill regulations.

Lesson 15: Landfill Safety and Contingency Countermeasures
