## Executive Summary:

In order to protect the West Tower Communications Centre from sustaining damage from future lightning strikes, it is necessary to install a structural lightning protection system along with grounding and surge protection upgrades. The communication Centre, which is responsible for supplying dispatch service to Police, Fire and is the primary answer site for 911 Emergency calls, sustained damage two years ago when hit directly by lightning. Since that time, extensive reviews of the building and associated solutions surrounding lightning protection have been considered.

The Police Board has reviewed this matter and is recommending the award of the tender by Council. Pursuant to the Purchasing By-law, an award of this amount requires Council's resolution.

### **Recommendation:**

THAT the proposal submitted by SAE Inc. for the purpose of West Tower Lightning Protection in the amount of \$125,399 plus GST, be approved with the funds to be drawn from Police Capital Account - Police Lightning Protection.

### **Background:**

In July, 1999, a direct lightning strike on the West Tower caused significant damage to communications equipment. A forensic audit was undertaken which determined steps must be taken to ensure that protection is in place to prevent any future damage to the system. John R. Hamalainen Engineering Ltd. was hired as the project consultant. Quotations were requested through Supplies and Services, which resulted in SAE Inc. being the successful bidder.

### **Current Situation:**

The total estimated cost of the project is \$170,000 including the SAE Inc. quotation. Other project costs relate to consultant fees and to work by Falcon Communications, which addresses the relocation of communications cables entry point into the building away from occupied areas. In July, 2000, funding was allocated for this project and approved by Regional Council. In order to award the contract to SAE Inc., additional funding was required and it was approved by City Council in July, 2001.

The Police Board has reviewed this matter and is recommending the award of the tender by Council. Pursuant to the Purchasing By-law, an award of this amount requires Council's resolution



# **Experience Finnish-Canadian Culture First-hand in Sudbury this August**

**SUDBURY** - Come and be a part of the magic in Sudbury from August 2nd to 5th. Finnish culture is alive and well across this country, and is especially thriving in the vibrant community of Sudbury, a city of 165 000 inhabitants, nestled amongst thirty freshwater lakes in Ontario's northeast. Sudbury, no longer a rocky moonscape, is host to this year's "Suurjuhlat" or Finnish-Canadian Grand Festival. Commencing on August 2nd with the official "kick-off ceremony" at Tom Davies Square, the festival will feature events that will appeal to young and old alike. As festival-goers can recall from the past, the Ladies of Kaleva "Finnada" Fashion Show is always the first event; the fashion show will be held at Laurentian University's Fraser Auditorium on the evening of Thursday, August 2nd. Friday, August 3rd will be a day that the enthusiastic golfer will remember: the Suurjuhlat Golf Tournament is being held at the Pine Grove Golf Club, just south of Sudbury. In addition to the three dances (one each night - Friday, Saturday, and Sunday) there will be live

entertainment, a "tori" or marketplace, sports, games, contests, and more. The marketplace will feature Finnish arts and crafts, delicacies such as homemade peasoup, open-faced sandwiches, Finnish coffee bread (pulla), desserts, and festival keepsakes. There will be plenty of food, beverages, and souvenirs for all and the prices will be reasonable. The marketplace will be open from 12:00pm until 5:00pm on Friday, 9:00am until 5:00pm on Saturday, and from 10:00am until 6:00pm on Sunday. Three spiritual programs will be held during the festival weekend – one on Friday evening at Silon Pentecostal Church, one on Saturday evening at St. Andrew's Place, and one on Sunday morning at St. Andrew's Place. Following the service on Sunday morning will be the laying of a wreath for War Veterans at Finlandia Village as well as the installation of a new church bell for the Holvakoti Chapel. Saturday, August 4th is one day that all festival-goers should not miss since the festival will be bustling with activity – everything from lectures by such people as Johanna Leskinen to book seminars by Olva Saarinen, Lewella Parker, Gerry Tapper, Börje Vähämäki, and Varpu Lindström. In addition, there will be pesäpallo games, a nature walk on the beautiful Bell Park Boardwalk on the shores of Sudbury's Ramsey Lake, a boot throw, log-sawing contest, the Ladies of Kaleva Art Show, historical displays, and a play entitled "Remontti" by a number of talented local Finnish actors and actresses. Furthermore, workshops will be held throughout the day on Saturday featuring some local talent – everything from woodcarving to weaving. On Sunday (hopefully the weather cooperates) one will be able to experience more of the festival by attending the festival parade and outdoor concert in the afternoon as well as the festival concert in the evening. Among the performers will be gymnasts, musicians, vocalists, choirs and dancers. Since the Finnish-Canadian Grand Festival is a gathering place for people to meet, there is no better place to hold meetings. Some of the groups scheduled to hold meetings include the Finnish-Canadian Cultural Federation (KSK), the Lions, the Finnish Expatriate Parliament, and the War Veterans. On Saturday, there will be a special children's program presented by the Sudbury Finnish Language School. Alongside the festival will be two other attractions which festival-goers should not miss: a Finnish art exhibition at the Art Gallery of Sudbury and a phenomenal display of photographs at Finlandia Village. So, why not head to Sudbury in a few weeks to experience what this city and its vibrant Finnish community have to offer. The Finnish culture is still alive and well in our neck of the woods. 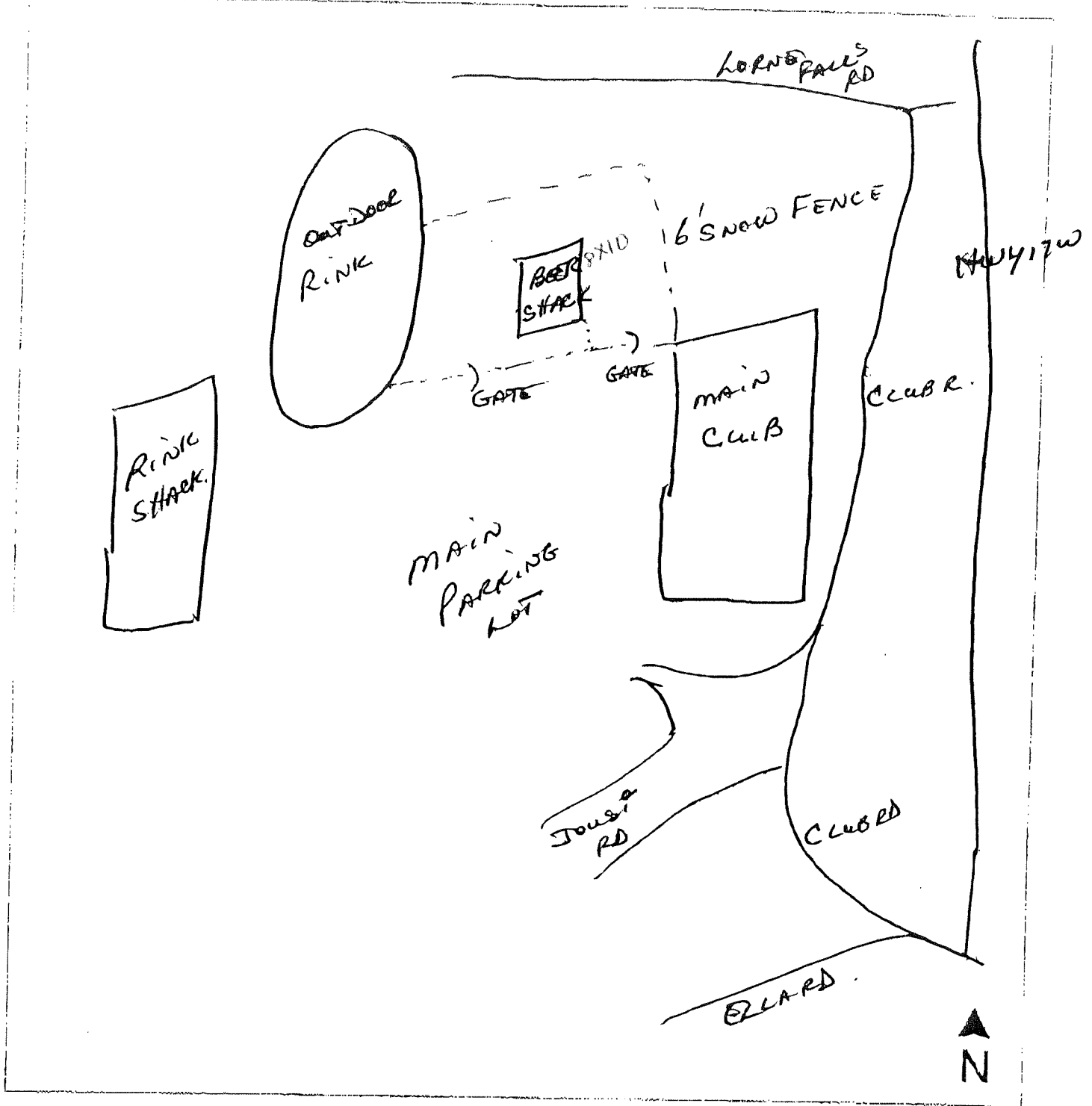
