Objective

- The following represents the results of a public opinion survey conducted for The City of Greater Sudbury.
- The objective of this survey was to gauge the opinions of residents of The City of Greater Sudbury on a series of issues related to life in community and about services.

Methodology and Logistics

Project Team

Study Sample

- A total of 1,200 respondents, 18 years of age and older, were interviewed in the survey. The sample was stratified with 200 respondents being randomly selected from each of the City's six Wards.
- The survey screened for the person at the contact residence who was responsible for making buying/payment decisions and other decisions related to areas such as their utility or municipal tax bills. In addition, the study sample was drawn using the "Random Digit Dialing" method.
- A total of 1,200 residents of the City of Greater Sudbury, 18 years of age and older, were contacted in this survey.

Survey Method

- The survey was conducted using computer-assisted techniques of telephone interviewing (CATI) and random number selection.
- Interviews were conducted in English or in French, as the respondent preferred.
- A total of 30% of all interviews were monitored and the management of Oraclepoll Research supervised 100%.

Logistics

- Interviews were conducted in December 2003.
- Initial calls were made from 5:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. with call-backs of no-answers and busy numbers made on a (staggered) daily rotating basis up to 5 times (from 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.) until contact was made. In addition, telephone interview appointments were attempted with those respondents unable to complete the survey at the time of contact.

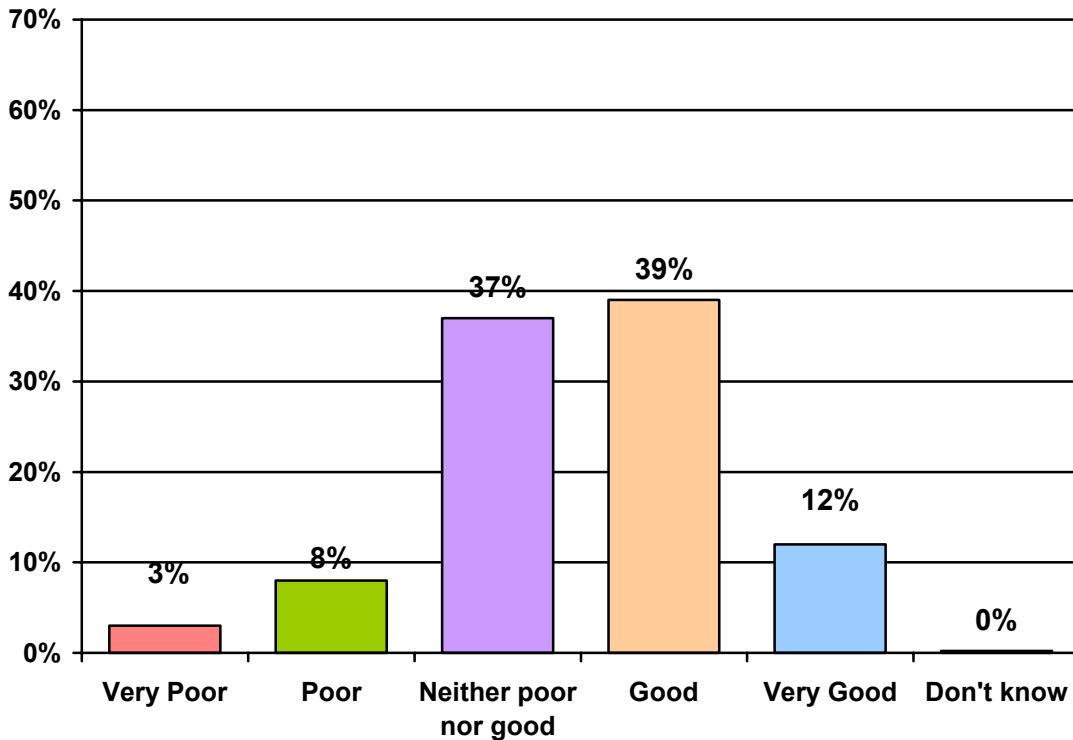
Confidence

- The margin of error for a survey of this nature is +/- 2.8%, 19/20 times.

Executive Summary

Our Community's Future

Quality of Life



Slightly more than half (51%) of respondents in December 2003 rated the overall **quality of life** in the community as positive and only 11% rated it as negative, while almost four in ten respondents (37%) parked their rating in the neutral or neither poor nor good category.

These findings are similar to the previous survey period in 2003 when 50% of respondents rated the overall **quality of life** in the community as positive, 10% rated it as negative, while four in ten respondents (40%) parked their rating in the neutral or satisfactory category.

Most important issues facing the Community

Respondents were asked what they felt were the most important issues facing the community.

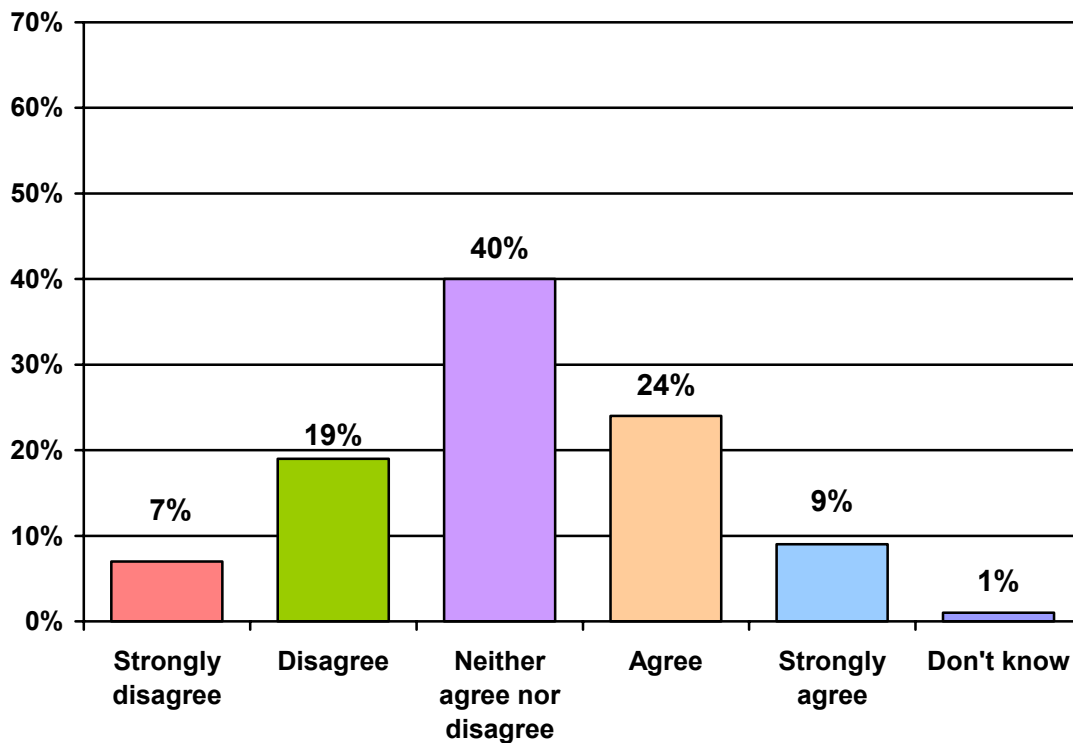

The issue of roads continues to be the most cited **top of mind issue** as now cited by almost one-third (31%) of respondents. Taxes, job creation and health care also remain as top four issues.

Confidence Areas

Respondents were asked to agree or disagree with the following statement.

"I am confident about the economic future of the community?"



One third of respondents (33%) were confident about the **economic future** of the community by agreeing or strongly agreeing with the statement. Results have improved over 2003 when less than one-quarter or 24% were confident about the community's future.

In addition, 34% of residents surveyed were of the opinion that the City is **changing for the better**, 25% felt that things have changed for the worse, while 38% stated that there has been no change and 3% did not know. Results are similar to the last survey when 31% of respondents were of the opinion that the community is changing for the better, 24% for the worse and 43% no change at all.

Municipal Services

Importance of services

Respondents were asked to rate the importance of a range of services that the City currently provides. The following table ranks each category by level of importance to respondents.

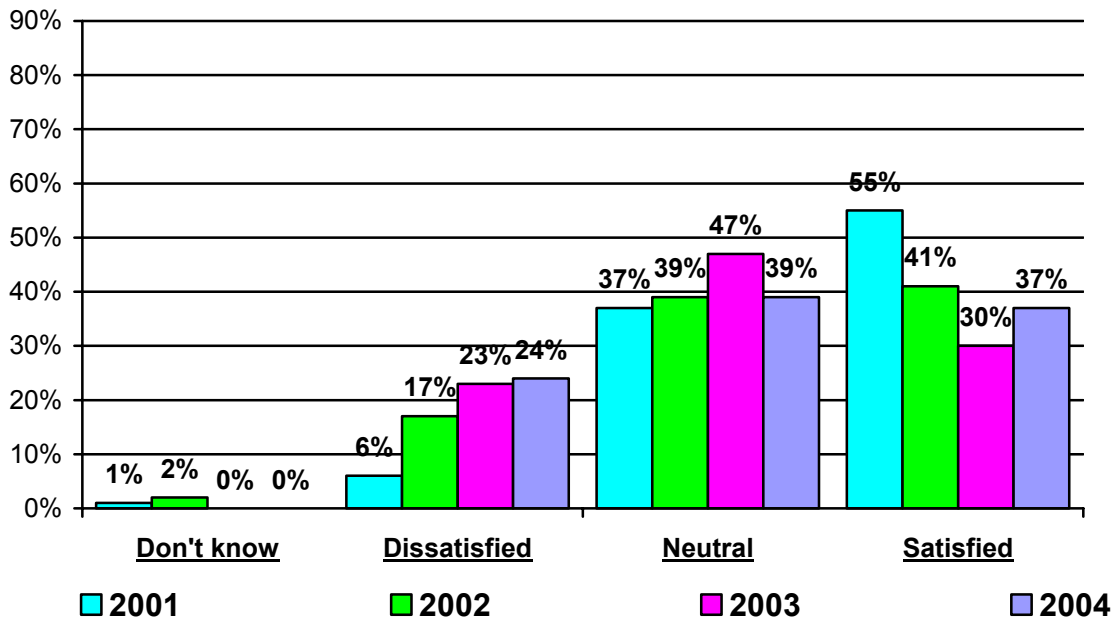

The strongest rating increases were for fire, public health and pioneer manor. Drops were most evident in the areas of leisure programs and recreational facilities.

Satisfaction with the Range of Services Provided by the City

Residents were asked to rate the **range of services** provided by the City of Greater Sudbury.

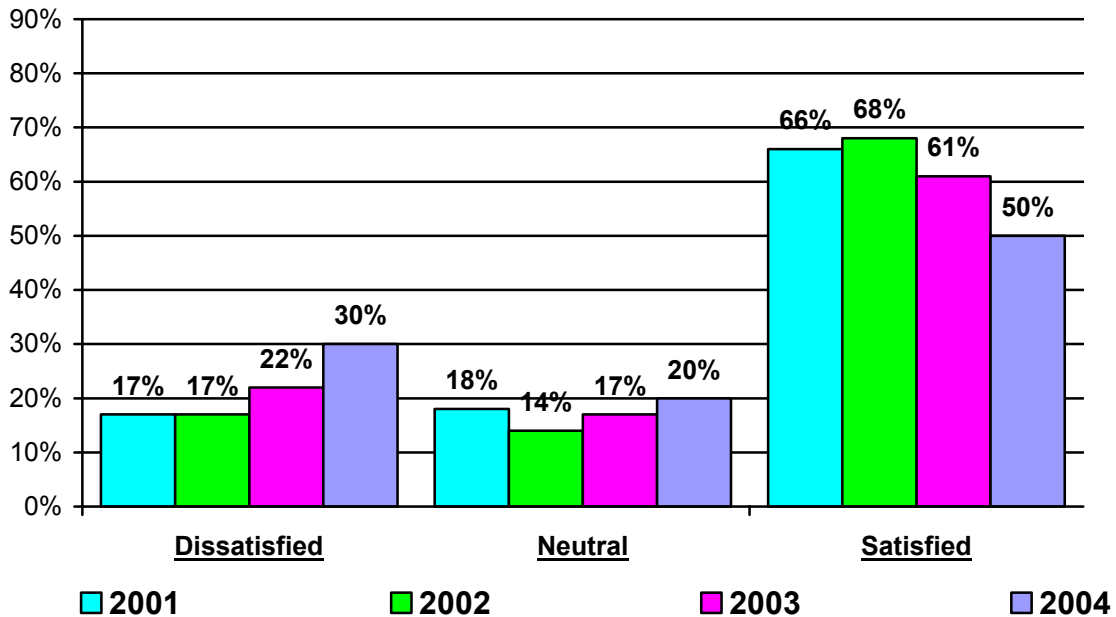


There was a 7% increase in the number of respondents that stated they were satisfied with the **range of services** provided by the City of Greater Sudbury. An improvement over last years result when only 30% said they were satisfied. The results still are in the low range.

Contact with a Municipal Staff Member

A total of 35% of residents claimed that they had contacted a municipal staff member in the past 12 months, compared to 38% in the previous survey

Residents who had contact were then asked to rate their satisfaction with this experience.



A total of 50% of those respondents who had **contact with a municipal staff member** stated that they were satisfied or very satisfied, which is a lower level of satisfaction than the previous year.

Respondents were read and asked to agree or disagree with each of the following **budget** related statements that have been tracked.
