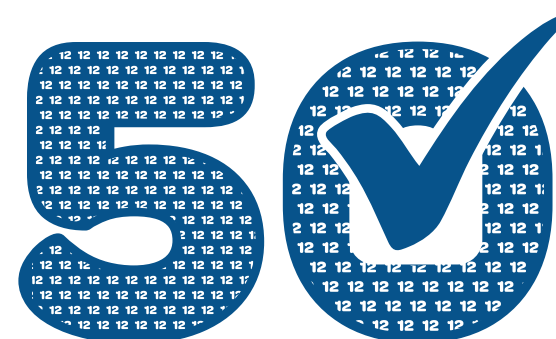


Join the challenge!

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- 1. Start a nature journal
- 2. Identify the plants in your school yard
- 3. Draw three plants you find outside
- 4. Learn to identify a white pine from a red pine
- 5. Build a bee or insect hotel out of stuff in your recycling bin or found outside
- 6. Learn five new birds and their calls
- 7. Find an ant and follow its trail - just observe without interfering
- 8. Learn to identify three constellations
- 9. Find and draw two different spider webs
- 10. Catch snowflakes on your tongue
- 11. Look for animal tracks in the snow
- 12. Pick up litter in your school yard
- 13. Make nature art (collage, prints, rubbings)
- 14. Eat lunch outside
- 15. Play a game of tic tac toe with rocks and sticks
- 16. Make a bird feeder out of stuff in your recycling bin or found outside
- 17. Put out bird seed in the winter
- 18. Make a wildflower bouquet
- 19. Follow the journey of stormwater from your schoolyard into nearby water bodies
- 20. Learn to identify five native plants
- 21. Read a book outside
- 22. Paint a rock
- 23. Write a poem about nature, in nature
- 24. Draw a map of your neighbourhood - include natural landmarks
- 25. Adopt a tree - pick one tree and record how it changes throughout the seasons



- 26. Build a fairy home
- 27. Make a nature weave
- 28. Play I Spy
- 29. Go on a bug hunt - record what you find in your nature journal
- 30. Make tree bark rubbings in the winter
- 31. Observe snowflakes under a magnifying glass
- 32. In the winter, count all the dreys (squirrel homes) you see
- 33. Do some snow painting (use biodegradable paint or food colouring)
- 34. Look for and draw the moon in each of its phases
- 35. Estimate the age of a tree - count the whorls
- 36. Go cloud watching
- 37. Search for winter berries but leave them for the birds
- 38. Look for a winter bird
- 39. Spot a bird's nest
- 40. Find and identify four different pinecones
- 41. Collect and compare seeds from ten different plants and trees
- 42. Plant a flower, tree or vegetable
- 43. Start a rock collection
- 44. Look for worms after it rains
- 45. Make a sundial using rocks and a stick
- 46. Go on an alphabet nature scavenger hunt
- 47. Participate in a Schoolyard Bird Blitz with Birds Canada
- 48. Build a Chimney Swift nest
- 49. Make a soil shake
- 50. Use snow to sculpt a face on a tree while incorporating features like knots, burrs and scars
