CONTEST RULES

The contest can be entered by all schools in the **City of Greater Sudbury**.

Interested schools must submit a **letter of intent** to enter the Ugliest Schoolyard Contest by **Friday April 27, 2018**. Please submit to Wayne Hugli at whugli@hotmail.com.

Contest **entry form** must be completed and submitted to your **School Board Office** by the **contest deadline** of Thursday, **May 10, 2018** where it will be picked up by a member of VETAC.

The winning school must commit to:

- hosting the launch of the project at the school site;
- erecting a suitable sign on the site which will include the logos of our organization and the sponsors (signage cost will be provided through project sponsors);
- supporting the project for at least one year.

JUDGING

A judging panel of representatives from the City of Greater Sudbury's VETAC committee will review the submissions and announce a winner **in early June**. The judges' decision will be final.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND COMMITMENTS

VETAC will work with the winning school to plan the Official Launch of the project.

The school will be asked to host this event and will be encouraged to hold an assembly of the student body on that day.

VETAC will be responsible for drawing up an agreement with the winning school and will help the school through the surveying and planning process and assist in drawing up the plans for the schoolyard project. VETAC will also guide the school through the implementation stages of the first year of the project and provide on-site management, support and advice.

The prizes will be administered by VETAC on behalf of the winning school for the implementation of the project following acceptance of the landscape plan.

Our organization, with your approval, will use photographs of your schoolyard improvement project to promote the contest to potential sponsors in future years.
