

What is Recyclable in the Blue Box



Corrugated cardboard and pizza boxes
(flatten and remove plastics)



Cereal/tissue box, cardboard tubes



Newspapers, magazines, catalogues, inserts, telephone books and books



Household paper



Clear and coloured glass jars/bottles



Milk and juice containers/cartons



Plastic bottles, jugs, tubs, pails, trays and foam packaging



Plastic bags



Aluminum and steel cans, aluminum foil, pie plates and trays



Cardboard cans



Empty paint cans and aerosol cans
(empty and dry, lids removed)



Egg cartons

Did you know?

The items listed below don't belong in the Blue Box. They belong in...

Green Cart	Leaf and Yard	Household Hazardous Waste Depot	Garbage
Paper coffee cups	Garden plants	Batteries	Plastic pet food bags
Sugar/flour/paper potato bags	Straw	Fluorescent lights	Chip/cookie bags
Waxed/tissue paper	Garden trimmings	Syringes	Foil juice pouch/snack bar wrapper
Paper towels/kleenex	Grass clippings	Propane/helium tanks	Foam peanuts
Cotton balls	Branches	Unused/expired medication	Plastic food wrap



Do not bag recyclables. Place items in the Blue Box loosely.

The two exceptions are shredded paper and styrofoam. These items can be placed in separate clear plastic bags.

If your Blue Box is full, you can place the extra recyclables beside it in a cardboard box.
