

Construction NOTICE



Walter Street, Coniston Bridge Replacement

The City of Greater Sudbury will be completing a **bridge replacement and watermain improvements** between **32 and 34 Walter Street., Coniston.**

Construction by the City's contractor, **Belanger Construction (1981) Inc.**, will be carried out between **June and November, 2022.**

Work will take place **Monday to Friday, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.**

Final asphalt will be completed in November 2022.

Please note these timelines are subject to change.

Construction Details:

- Removal of the existing Walter Street Bridge including guiderail, abutment, retaining walls, wing walls and foundation.
- Remove and replace existing asphalt pavement and waterproofing.
- Supply and drive H-Pile deep foundations.
- Supply and install new open-bottom precast concrete culvert.
- Supply and form new concrete distribution slab.
- Install new reinforced concrete sidewalk and transition ramp.
- Supply and form new gabion basket walls.
- Place substrate in creek bed backfill, compact and grade road surface.
- Reconstruction of the road approaches.
- Remove and replace existing watermain per limit.



During construction, there may be dust and noise in the area. The City makes every effort to reduce the impact to nearby residents and business owners. Thank you for your patience as we work to improve the roads and infrastructure in your neighbourhood. The City of Greater Sudbury and its contractors are committed to public safety and will monitor the ongoing progress of construction.

	<p>Before Construction Begins:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Property owners should remove items located within the municipal right-of-way, such as landscaping, fencing, sprinkler systems and decorative objects. Property owners should redirect to above ground, any roof drains and /or sump pump outlets that currently discharge into the front ditch. The City is not responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on the municipal right-of-way.
	<p>Possible Water Service Disruptions:</p> <p>On occasion, during construction, the water supply to your property may need to be shut off. The contractor will provide at least 24-hours notice. If you do not receive advance notice of a water disruption, this may mean an emergency shut-off was necessary. It is recommended that you disconnect any water treatment systems, such as water softeners or filters, during scheduled water service disruptions.</p>
	<p>Traffic:</p> <p>Plans are in place to manage traffic in the area to ensure the safety of workers and residents. You may experience some delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p>A full road closure will occur on Walter Street at the bridge location, from July to November 2022. Residents west of 34 Walter Street, as well as Cook Street will require to take the south loop of Walter Street to access William Avenue. Residents east of 32 Walter Street will require to take the north portion of Walter Street to access William Avenue. Detour signage will be displayed during construction.</p> <p>Please be advised that construction equipment will be accessing the project location via residential areas. Belanger Construction's traffic control personnel will be on site to direct their vehicles and equipment as required. However, please exercise caution when sharing the road with construction equipment.</p>
	<p>Driveway Access:</p> <p>If temporary driveway closures are required, the contractor will provide notice to the affected properties and make arrangements for alternative access and parking when necessary. Entrances to businesses and public institutions shall remain accessible at all times.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access:</p> <p>Safe access for pedestrians will be maintained. Parents are reminded to teach children about road safety in active construction zone areas. Residents who have accessibility needs, such as wheelchair access, are asked to contact the City Field Inspector or Project Manager listed on this notice.</p>
	<p>Inspections:</p> <p>Belanger Construction will complete a review of structure and building conditions prior to the beginning of construction. These inspections will only be performed with permission from the property owner.</p>
	<p>Pile Driving / Vibration:</p> <p>During Construction:</p> <p>During pile driving operations you can expect to feel some vibration and hear some noise. The sound following each blow of a pile driver will be a striking sound, which is harmless. Vibration levels are monitored during the pile driving operations by the Contractor to ensure levels are within allowable ranges.</p> <p>After Construction:</p> <p>Once the work is complete, upon request to the Contractor, the post-construction survey of your home can be made available to you.</p>
	<p>Emergency Services and Public Transit:</p> <p>Access for police, fire and paramedic services vehicles will be maintained at all times. Public transit detours may occur during construction. Please call GOVA at 705-675-3333 or visit www.greatersudbury.ca/gova/ for information. Should the work affect the school bus route, the Sudbury Student Services Consortium will inform you of any changes to the scheduled route.</p>
	<p>Garbage Collection:</p> <p>Garbage, recycling, and leaf and yard trimmings pickup will not be affected by construction. Please place your waste at the front of your property before 7 a.m. on your regular collection day. If waste collection vehicles are unable to access properties in the construction area, the contractor will transport the waste outside of the zone for pickup. Your garbage, recycling and organics containers will be returned to your property later in the day. Please ensure your containers are labeled with your address so that they can be returned to you.</p>
