MR80 Active Transportation Improvements Highway 69N (MR80), Val Caron

The City of Greater Sudbury is planning active transportation improvements on Highway 69N (MR80), between Main Street and the Val Caron Mall, in Val Caron.

This project is part of the Council-approved Capital Project for Active Transportation to construct cycling infrastructure connectivity and road retrofits. Council approved an annual budget for the phased construction of cycling infrastructure, including the construction of a three (3) metre wide multi-use path on the west side of Highway 69N (MR80) from Main Street to Yorkshire Drive.

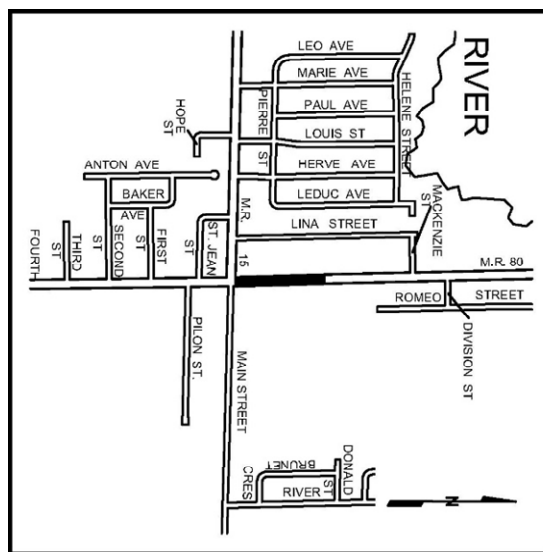
Project Highlights:

- **Phase One** includes the construction of a three (3) metre wide multi-use path on the west side of Highway 69N (MR80) from Main Street to the Val Caron Mall and is expected to be completed in 2023 with subsequent phases completed in future years.

Expected Start Date: Summer 2023

Expected End Date: Fall/Winter 2023

Once a Contractor has been selected, affected property owners will receive a construction notice with more information about the work.

Before Construction Begins:

- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Property owners should redirect to above ground, any roof drains and/or sump pump outlets that currently discharge into the front ditch.
- **The City is not responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on the municipal right-of-way.** Property owners should remove items located within the municipal right-of-way, such as landscaping, fencing, sprinkler systems and decorative objects.
