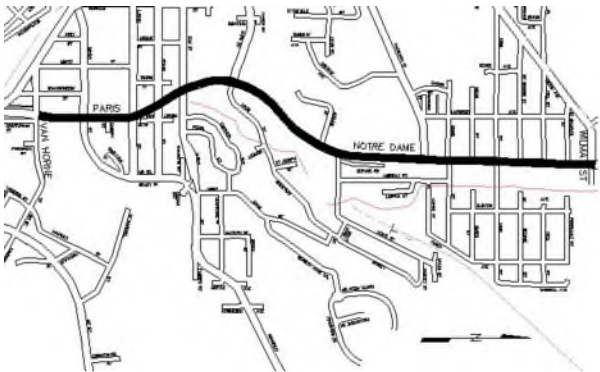
## Paris/Notre Dame Bikeway

The City of Greater Sudbury will continue the **Active Transportation Improvements** on **Paris Street and Notre Dame Avenue**, between Wilma and Van Horne Streets, Sudbury.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2023 Capital Project for cycling infrastructure to support the City’s investment in active transportation networks, and to construct cycling infrastructure connectivity.

**Project Highlights:**

- Retrofit a new separated cycling facility on the east and west sides of Paris Street and Notre Dame Avenue
- New concrete sidewalk, curb and gutter
- New pedestrian ramps, pavement markings and signage
- Street lighting and intersection upgrades

**Year 2 Construction: May 2024 to October 2024**

**Before Construction Begins:**

- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Once a Contractor has been selected, affected property owners will receive a construction notice with more information about the work.
