Traffic Calming Michelle Drive, Hanmer

The City of Greater Sudbury will be completing permanent traffic calming improvements on Michelle Drive, between Old Highway 69 and Ivan Street, in Hanmer.

Construction by the City's Contractor, Interpaving Ltd. is expected to be completed August, 2023

Work will typically take place during daylight hours Monday to Friday

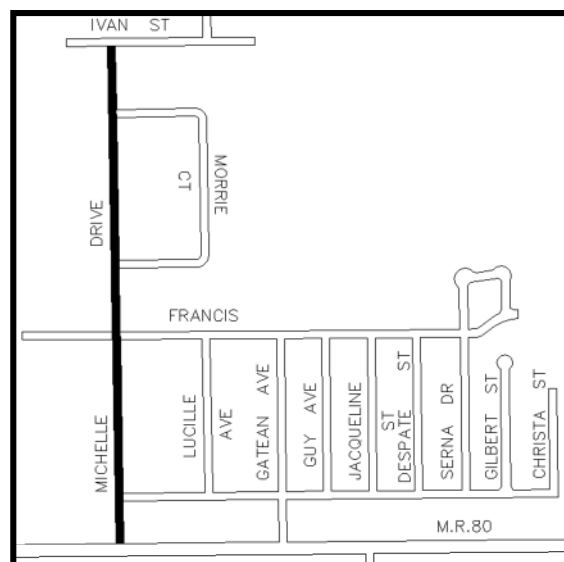
Construction Details

- The construction of six speed humps and the installation of two speed radar cameras.

Benefits of speed humps

Speed humps are a form of traffic calming used to reduce the impacts of traffic on neighbourhoods and public facilities such as parks, school areas, and community centres.

A speed hump is a gradual rise and fall of the pavement surface along the roadway extending across the pavement width. Generally, speed humps used on residential streets are four metres long with a maximum height of 80 mm. Speed humps differ from speed bumps which are seen in many private parking lots. Speed bumps cause most vehicles to slow down to almost a stop to go over it. Speed humps, on the other hand are designed so most vehicles can go over them at 30 kmh without causing driver discomfort.



During construction, there may be dust and noise in the area. The City makes every effort to reduce the impact to nearby residents and business owners. Thank you for your patience as we work to improve the roads and infrastructure in your neighbourhood. The City of Greater Sudbury and its contractors are committed to public safety and will monitor the ongoing progress of construction.

	<p>Before Construction Begins:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Property owners should remove items located within the municipal right-of-way, such as landscaping, fencing, sprinkler systems and decorative objects. <p>The City is not responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on the municipal right-of-way.</p>
	<p>Traffic:</p> <p>Plans are in place to manage traffic in the area to ensure the safety of workers and residents. You may experience some delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. At times, Michelle Drive, Hanmer may be reduced to one lane of traffic to accommodate construction.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access:</p> <p>Access for pedestrians will be maintained. Parents are reminded to teach children about road safety in active construction zone areas. Residents who have accessibility needs, such as wheelchair access, are asked to contact the City Field Inspector or Project Manager listed on this notice.</p>
	<p>Emergency Services and Public Transit:</p> <p>Access for police, fire and paramedic services vehicles will be maintained at all times. Public transit detours may occur during construction. Please call GOVA at 705-675-3333 or visit www.greatersudbury.ca/gova/ for information.</p>
	<p>Garbage Collection:</p> <p>Garbage, recycling, and leaf and yard trimmings pickup will not be affected by construction. Please place your waste at the front of your property before 7 a.m. on your regular collection day. If waste collection vehicles are unable to access properties in the construction area, the contractor will transport the waste outside of the zone for pickup. Your garbage, recycling and organics containers will be returned to your property later in the day. Please ensure your containers are labeled with your address so that they can be returned to you.</p>
