



# Season Start-Up Notice

## Tenth Avenue, Lively Infrastructure Upgrades and Improvements

The City of Greater Sudbury will continue infrastructure upgrades and improvements on Tenth Avenue, between MR 24 to Eighth Avenue, in Lively.

Construction by the City's contractor, Teranorth Construction & Engineering Ltd., will start April 5, 2023 and will be completed over the 2023 construction season.

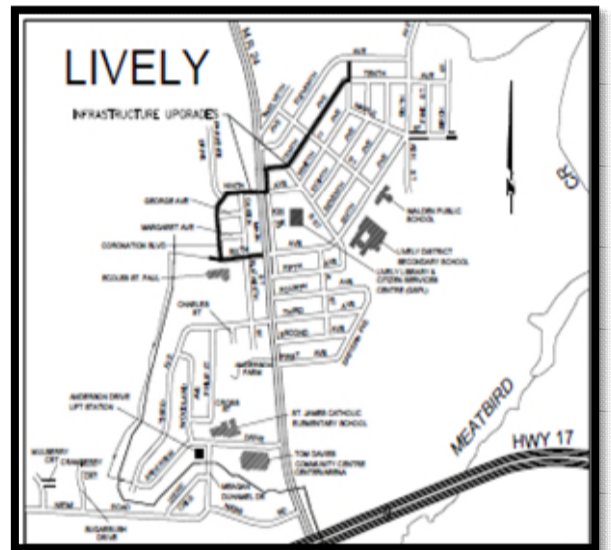
Work will typically take place during daylight hours.

**Final asphalt will be completed on August 12, 2023.**

- Concrete curb and sidewalk
- Underground infrastructure upgrades
- Pave surface course of asphalt
- Property restoration

# Construction Notice



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|    | <p><b>Before Construction Begins:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Property owners should remove items located within the municipal right-of-way, such as landscaping, fencing, sprinkler systems and decorative objects.</li> <li>Property owners should redirect to above ground, any roof drains and /or sump pump outlets that currently discharge into the front ditch.</li> </ul> <p><b>The City is not responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on the municipal right-of-way.</b></p>   |
|    | <p><b>Possible Water Service Disruptions:</b></p> <p>On occasion, during construction, the water supply to your property may need to be shut off. The contractor will provide at least 24-hours notice. If you do not receive advance notice of a water disruption, this may mean an emergency shut-off was necessary. It is recommended that you disconnect any water treatment systems, such as water softeners or filters, during scheduled water service disruptions.</p>  |
|    | <p><b>Traffic:</b></p> <p>Plans are in place to manage traffic in the area to ensure the safety of workers and residents. You may experience some delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p>At times, <b>Tenth Avenue</b> may be reduced to one lane of traffic to accommodate construction.</p> <p>A full road closure will occur on <b>Tenth Avenue</b>, from <b>Nineth Avenue</b> to <b>Eighth Avenue</b>. The road(s) will remain open to local traffic and emergency vehicles at all times.</p>  |
|  | <p><b>Driveway Access:</b></p> <p>If temporary driveway closures are required, the contractor will provide notice to the affected properties and make arrangements for alternative access and parking when necessary.</p> <p><b>Entrances to businesses and public institutions shall remain accessible at all times.</b></p>  |
|  | <p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b></p> <p>Safe access for pedestrians will be maintained. Parents are reminded to teach children about road safety in active construction zone areas. Residents who have accessibility needs, such as wheelchair access, are asked to contact the City Field Inspector or Project Manager listed on this notice.</p>  |
|  | <p><b>Inspections:</b></p> <p><b>Englobe Corp.</b> will complete a review of structure and building conditions prior to the beginning of construction. These inspections will only be performed with permission from the property owner.</p>   |
|  | <p><b>Blasting:</b></p> <p><b>During Construction:</b></p> <p>During blasting operations, you can expect to feel some vibration and hear some noise. The sound following the blast is a shock wave or air concussion, which is harmless. Vibration levels are monitored during the blasting operations by the consultant to ensure levels are within allowable ranges.</p> <p><b>After Construction:</b></p> <p>Once the work is complete, upon request to the Contractor, the post-blast survey of your home can be made available to you.</p>  |
|  | <p><b>Emergency Services and Public Transit:</b></p> <p>Access for police, fire and paramedic services vehicles will be maintained at all times. Public transit detours may occur during construction. Please call GOVA at 705-675-3333 or visit <a href="http://www.greatersudbury.ca/gova/">www.greatersudbury.ca/gova/</a> for information. Should the work affect the school bus route, the Sudbury Student Services Consortium will inform you of any changes to the scheduled route.</p>   |
|  | <p><b>Garbage Collection:</b></p> <p>Garbage, recycling, and leaf and yard trimmings pickup will not be affected by construction. Please place your waste at the front of your property before 7 a.m. on your regular collection day. If waste collection vehicles are unable to access properties in the construction area, the contractor will transport the waste outside of the zone for pickup. Your garbage, recycling and organics containers will be returned to your property later in the day. <b>Please ensure your containers are labeled with your address so that they can be returned to you.</b></p> |
