
New Sidewalk Installation, Old Highway 69 (MR80), Hanmer, Glenn Street to Notre Dame Avenue

The City of Greater Sudbury will recommence work on the New Sidewalk Installation on the south side of Old Highway 69 (MR80), Hanmer, between Glenn Street and Notre Dame Avenue.

Construction by the City's contractor, Interpaving Ltd., will begin in May, 2021 and will be completed by July 2021.

Why is this sidewalk being built?

The City of Greater Sudbury is actively working towards becoming a more pedestrian friendly community. Each year, the City receives a number of requests for sidewalks to be installed throughout the City. In 2017, the City developed a comprehensive and objective tool, the Sidewalk Priority Index, to prioritize locations where sidewalks should be installed, based on a variety of factors, including road classification, speed, and volume, proximity to parks and schools, and number of pedestrian collisions. This section of MR80 is the highest ranked location in the City. When constructed, area residents will have a 4.8 km continuous walkway which runs from Notre Dame Avenue to Desmarais Road and is maintained year round.



During construction, there may be dust and noise in the area. The City makes every effort to reduce the impact to nearby residents and business owners. Thank you for your patience as we work to improve the roads and infrastructure in your neighbourhood. The City of Greater Sudbury and its contractors are committed to public safety and will monitor the ongoing progress of construction.

Traffic:

Plans are in place to manage traffic in the area to ensure the safety of workers and residents. You may experience some delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.

At times, Old Highway 69 (MR80) may be reduced to one lane of traffic to accommodate construction.



Driveway Access:

If temporary driveway closures are required, the contractor will provide notice to the affected properties and make arrangements for alternative access and parking when necessary. **Entrances to businesses and public institutions shall remain accessible at all times.**



Road and Sidewalk Access:

Safe access for pedestrians will be maintained. Parents are reminded to teach children about road safety in active construction zone areas. Residents who have accessibility needs, such as wheelchair access, are asked to contact the City Field Inspector or Project Manager listed on this notice.



Emergency Services and Public Transit:

Access for police, fire and paramedic services vehicles will be maintained at all times. Public transit detours may occur during construction. Please call GOVA at 705-675-3333 or visit **www.greatersudbury.ca/gova/** for information. Should the work affect the school bus route, the Sudbury Student Services Consortium will inform you of any changes to the scheduled route.



Garbage Collection:

Garbage, recycling, and leaf and yard trimmings pickup will not be affected by construction. Please place your waste at the front of your property before 7 a.m. on your regular collection day. If waste collection vehicles are unable to access properties in the construction area, the contractor will transport the waste outside of the zone for pickup. Your garbage, recycling and organics containers will be returned to your property later in the day. Please ensure your containers are labeled with your address so that they can be returned to you.
