

# Road Safety Community Sign Program

*Spring 2017*

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The **Road Safety Community Sign Program** is an initiative of the Sudbury Road Safety Committee, a partnership between City of Greater Sudbury, the Greater Sudbury Police Service and the Sudbury & District Health Unit, to help reduce speeding and raise driver awareness in residential neighbourhoods. The program provides residents with lawn signs to remind drivers to slow down and watch for vulnerable road users such as pedestrians, cyclists, children, seniors and people with disabilities or those who use mobility devices.

A limited number of lawn signs are available for display on residential lawns for up to 30 days at a time. To maximize the impact of this sign program, the Sudbury Road Safety Committee is seeking individuals to serve as Community Leads, to coordinate the display of signs in their respective neighbourhoods. If you are interested in becoming a Community Lead, please submit the application form below to the Roads and Transportation Services Division.

Signs are available free of charge, and will be loaned out on a first come, first served basis. Greater Sudbury Roads and Transportation Services will make every effort to ensure that all communities wishing to participate in the program will have an opportunity to do so.

# Road Safety Community Sign Program

## Application Form – Community Participant

This application form must be completed by each participating household, represented by a resident age 18 or over.

By completing this form I agree to display a lawn sign on my property and to the following conditions for display:

- Each participating household is limited to a maximum of one sign
- Signs must be installed on private property and not on city-owned boulevards, sidewalks or rights-of-way
- Signs must be installed using the frame provided and not on utility poles, traffic control signal poles or trees
- Signs must not constitute a tripping hazard nor obstruct the sight lines of drivers, cyclists or pedestrians
- Signs must be installed facing oncoming traffic

City of Greater Sudbury Roads and Transportation Division reserve the right to remove signs at its discretion.
