



EarlyON Family Survey November 2025

An online bilingual survey was conducted in November 2025 with 291 responses from families who attended EarlyON programming.



Families' Experiences

Families value EarlyON centres for helping children play, learn and socialize, while giving parents a place to connect with other caregivers and feel part of a community. They consistently praised the friendly, supportive staff and the wide range of activities available.



Experience Ratings

- Majority strongly agree EarlyON is accessible, inclusive, supportive and beneficial for child development
- High recommendation rates to friends



Barriers to Attendance

- Work schedules and limited hours
- Transportation and location challenges
- Children aging out of programs
- Illness or program closures



Desired Improvements

- Expanded hours: evenings, weekends, after-school
- More outdoor and active programs
- Programs for older children (6+)
- Better website/calendar usability
- Coffee/snacks for parents, larger spaces, more organized crafts

- EarlyON is welcoming and accepting of everyone96%
- I have a voice and am heard by staff92%
- The centres have toys, books or activities that reflect my family's ethnicity/culture/experiences.....90%
- EarlyON supports my family's health and well-being91%
- It's easy for my family to access EarlyON (times, location, transportation, language)90%
- My family has a sense of belonging and connection there89%
- By attending EarlyON, I learned about other services and supports that helped my family78%

1. To give child opportunities to play with others86%
2. To meet/socialize with other parents and caregivers58%
3. To support child's development50%
4. To support my mental health and well-being24%
5. For practical support (a break, extra food, access to toys and materials)20%
6. To help child prepare for school20%

1. Went back to work 53%
2. Youngest child started school 18%
3. Too difficult to attend (times, locations, transportation) . 13%
4. No longer have children under the age of 6 4%
5. Child started daycare 3%
6. Busy with other things 3%
7. Didn't feel comfortable in the environment 2%
8. Homeschool/new baby 1%
9. Moved out of Greater Sudbury 1%

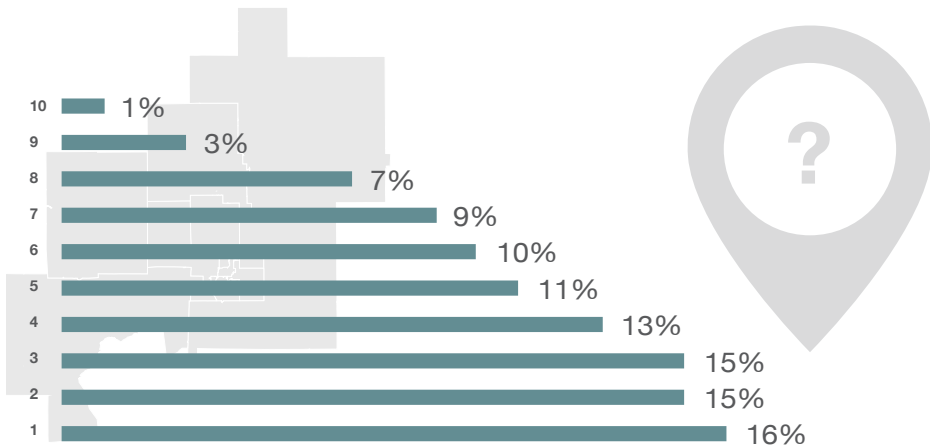

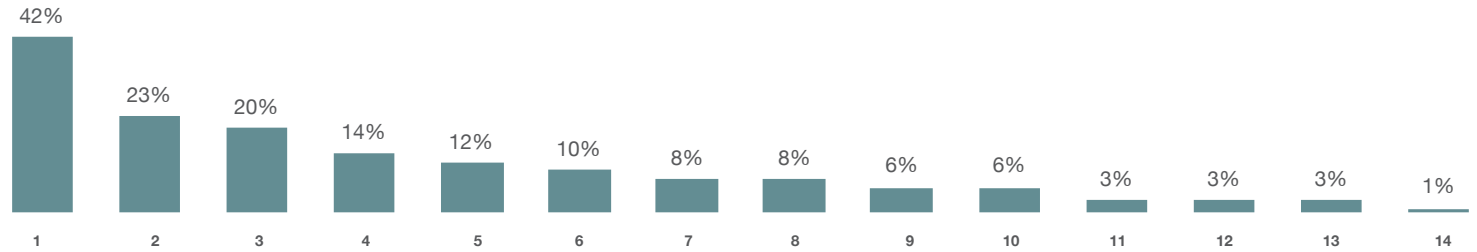
