## Homelessness Funding In The City of Greater Sudbury

Total Funding Allocated for Homelessness in 2002 was 1.3 million  
(municipal, provincial and federal contributions)

## **People Helping People Homelessness Initiative (SCPI)**

The first small community in Ontario and the second in Canada to have a Community Plan approved.

\$696,000 awarded.

The Federal Coordinator on Homelessness, the Honourable Claudette Bradshaw visited Sudbury in October 2001. The HRDC sent in a film crew at the same time and video taped 2 of the projects which are going to be part of a video on different SCPI projects in Ontario.

Deborah Wallace, Director of Homelessness for Ontario (HRDC), has been here in both May and June 2002 to attend the Task Force on Emergency Shelters and Homelessness and to visit some of the projects.

Both Minister Bradshaw and Deborah Wallace have indicated that Sudbury is progressing in the way that Supporting Communities Partnership Initiative (SCPI) was originally envisioned and they are following our activities closely.

Three of our projects have been termed as unique and easy to implement - as a result 2 of the projects were invited to present at "Homelessness 11 Forum" last fall and at "What Works Best In Homelessness" in March 2002. (Both forums had participants from across the province of Ontario).

Five of the members of the Task Force on Emergency Shelters and Homelessness were invited to a Public Policy Forum in Ottawa and one of these members was invited to the national workshop on March 27, 2002.

Funding for SCPI to expire March 31, 2003.
